Ruskin Crinkle Crankle Club was formed early in 2011, as a voluntary community association which plants and maintains Ruskin Hall's walled kitchen garden. As far as possible the garden is maintained organically.


The garden has an area of about 1200 square metres. It has a listed crinkle crankle wall at its northern boundary. The crinkle-crankles are angular rather than the usual serpentine shape. It is first shown on a map dated 1802, and the new layout is based on the earliest extant plan, dating from 1876.

The garden was neglected after 1945, but Ruskin College has now restored the walls and cleared and re-landscaped the site. Espaliered fruit trees are being planted along the northern, eastern and western walls, whilst there are freestanding fruit trees in the shady southern border. The garden slopes downhill from south to north, so the main part has been terraced. The lower half is divided into 10 half-strips, cultivated by individual plot holders. The upper half is divided into two much broader strips, planted with soft fruit and vegetables on a communal basis. Part of this area is reserved for Ruskin students. In front of the crinkle crankle wall, there is a herb garden, planted as a knot garden made up of three pentagons following the line of the crinkle crankles.



The inside of Ruskin's crinkle crankle wall (left) faces south, and is lined with red bricks to provide extra warmth for fruit. There are stone quoins at the angles.





The RCCC has Members and Patrons:

Members pay no subscription. They, including holders of individual plots, are expected to work on the communal aspects of the garden, either cultivating it, or on the organisation of events, or on the organisation of the Club itself.

In return, they receive unlimited access to the garden, a badge (to identify them to Ruskin students and staff), free admission to events organised in or for the garden, and a share of the produce.

Patrons make donations, which may be one-off or recurring. Patrons receive advance notice of events, including events for members as well as public events. They receive the newsletter. They may specify that their donations are for particular items, such as fruit trees or specific improvements.
